Distribution of Uncle Tefy

The distribution of Uncle Tefy has begun. First of all we delivered the 385 books which were printed with means from the company Heinzmann in Schöna. These are going to be distributed among schools and children in the area of Ambohimanam-bola, east of the town of Antsirabe in the highland. **Vakoka Vakiteny** will also provide some training and courses for the teachers on these schools to ensure that our philosophy about joy of reading is maintained.

A Norwegian lady, Mrs. Ebba Hauken who recently had birthday asked all her friends to donate money to Vakoka Vakiteny instead of buying presents. Together with some money from the municipality of Stavanger this will make 70 books for the school La Joie in Antsirabe which previously also has received books from **Vakoka Vakiteny**. We will have some training for the teachers and read for the children from our books at this school in May or June. **Vakoka Vakiteny** wants to thank Mrs Hauken and the municipality of Stavanger for this particular possibility.

The distribution of the books will continue in the southern parts of Madagascar. We will also try to sell some of the books on the free market with the aim of being able to finance future projects.



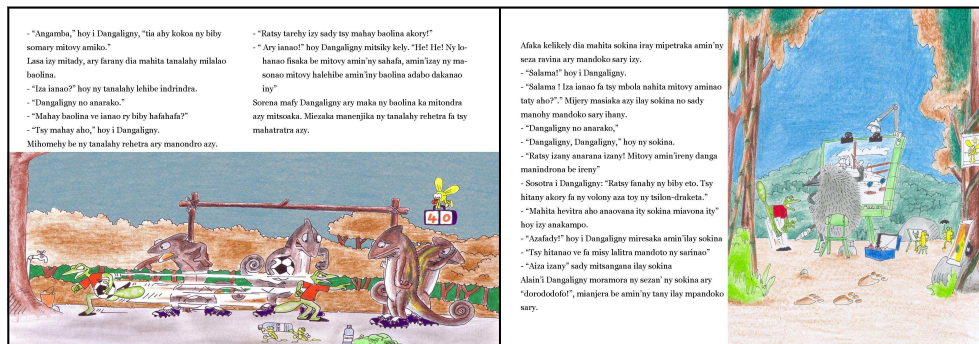
Reprint of Dangaligny and Konaky

The very first book we released was the children's book *Dangaligny and Konaky*. This was in 2007. Now a second edition of this book is ready. The pictures are the same as in the first edition, but the layout inside the book has changed and the text has been somewhat shortened. This has been done in order to make the text easier readable for the children. In the first edition of the book, the text was inside the pictures, whereas now the text is on white background. We also have increased the character size and the space between the lines.



The printing of this second edition is partly sponsored by the Reading Centre (Lesesenteret) at the University of Stavanger. They will donate 10 000 NOK (1250 €) for this purpose. In order to be able to print an acceptable number of copies, Vakoka Vakiteny will cover some of the financing by other sources.

The printing of the book is estimated to be done in a few months time.



Page 10 and 11 in the new edition of *Dangaligny and Konaky*

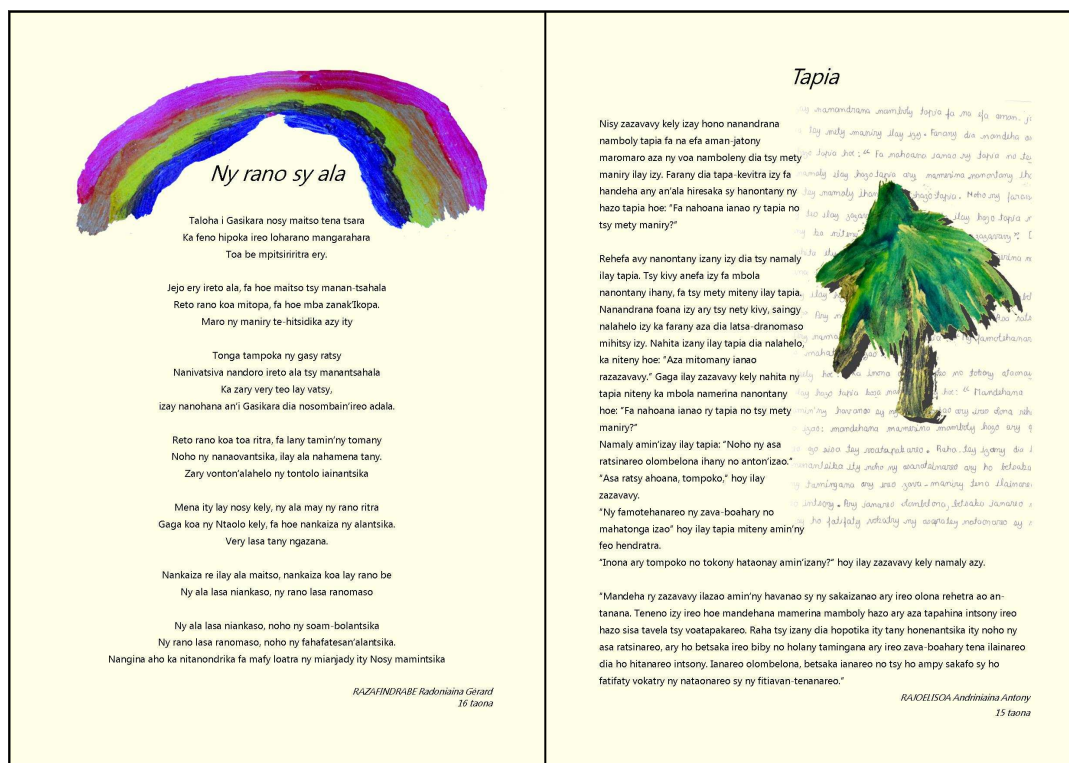
Geographic picture book

Now all the photos for the geographic picture book are taken and we have begun to put them together for the book. We continue the writing of over 50 small texts about towns, nature and people in the 6 provinces of Madagascar. Our illustrator for this book, Voninirina Rakotoson, has started to draw the maps for the book. We hope to have the manuscript ready for printing by April/ May.

Ampanirio, the "green book"

We continue the work with the "green book" Ampanirio which we presented in the last newsletter. The proofreading of the texts is already finished. As soon as the coloring of the last pictures is done, the manuscript will be sent out for correction and approval to the group who was involved in the workshop where the texts were written.

The title we have chosen, "Ampanirio", is the title of a poem written by one of the participants in the workshop. Ampanirio means "make it grow!" in Malagasy, but the verb "to grow" can also mean "to hope". This title underlines the aim of all the different texts in the book: to encourage youth to take care of the environment in Madagascar and to never give up hope.

Vakôka Vakiteny has finally met the author of the youth novel about the street girl Todisia. Nasrin Siege lives in Addis Ababa, and we were able to meet her several times when we were there in February. It was very inspiring to see her and talk to her. She suggested us to apply for sponsoring for the translation at the Goethe institute in Antananarivo, which we also did. Now it remains to see if our application will be accepted or not.

The original German version of the book about Todisia will be launched in Germany in August, and after this we can hopefully begin the printing of the Malagasy edition.
